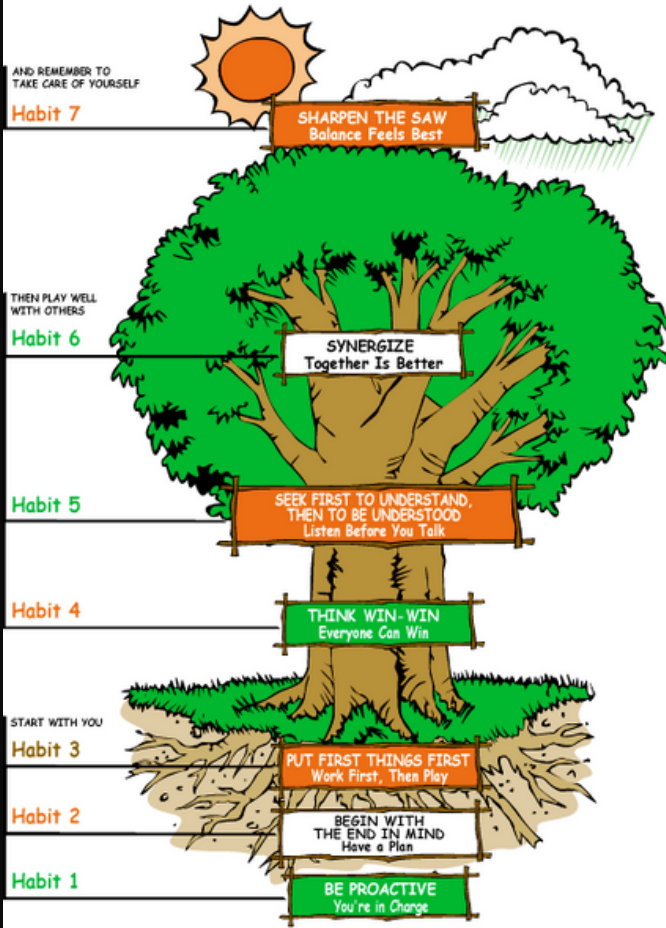

Ski Days

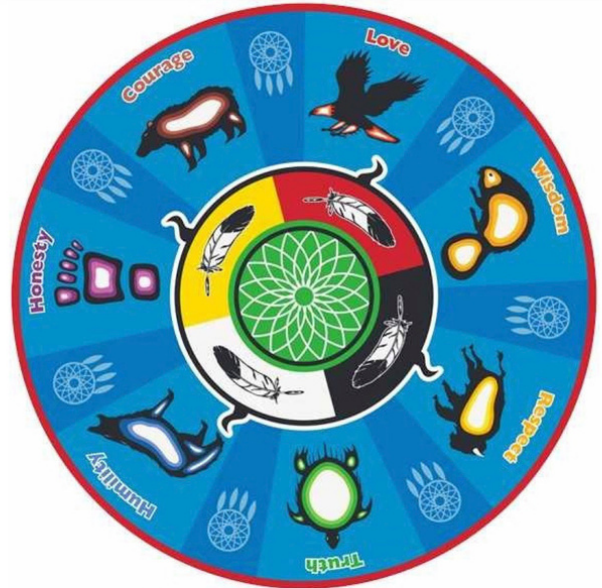
