Our Boys won the bronze medal out of 16 teams and the girls went undefeated to bring home the championship trophy out of 10 teams competing.

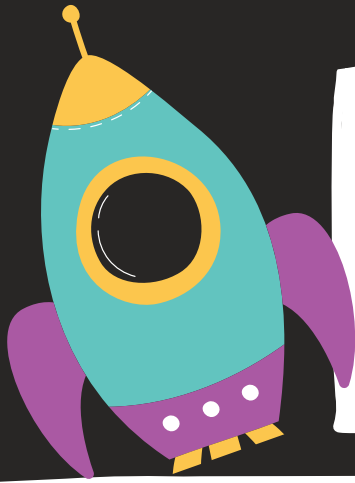

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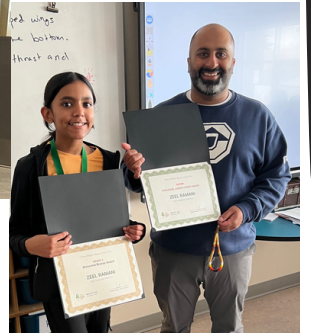

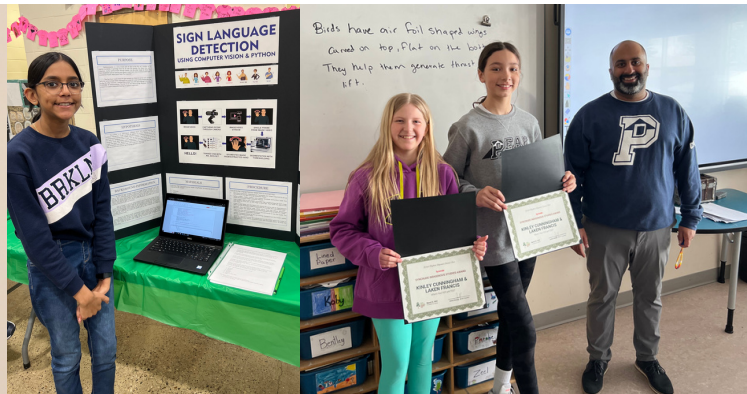

We had ten projects represent WGH at the Regional Science Fair and all did an excellent job sharing their research and application of the scientific method.

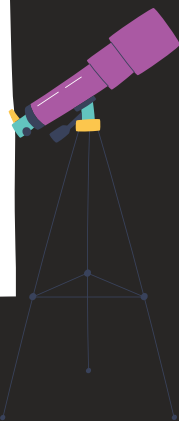
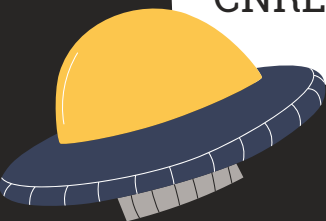

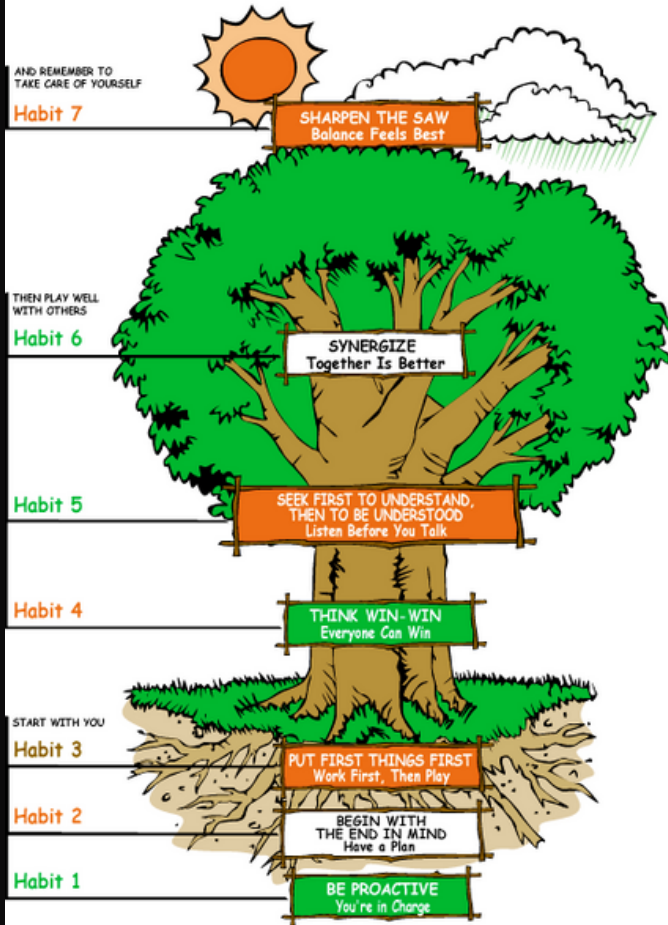
