



CIRCLE OF SECURITY

STRENGTHENING THE PARENT-CHILD RELATIONSHIP

What is Circle of Security?

It is a program designed to strengthen the parent-child relationship. Using a visual map of caregiver-child attachment, it supports caregivers in meeting their child's emotional needs for exploring the world and returning for comfort.



Always: **Be BIGGER, STRONGER, WISER, and KIND.**Whenever possible: **Follow your child's need.**Whenever necessary: **Take charge.**



Why Attend?

After 60 years of research we know secure children are more likely to:

- Enjoy happiness with parents
- Turn to their parents for support when in trouble
- Solve problems and get along better with friends
- Solve problems independently
- Have better relationships with siblings
- Have higher self-esteem
- Trust the people they love
- Believe that good things will come their way
