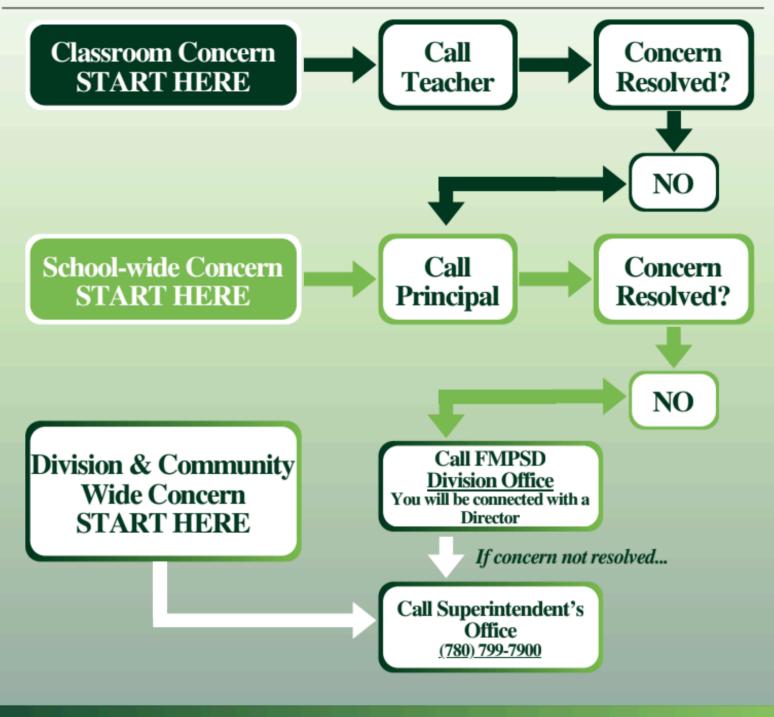




### **Executive Function Highlight**
