EXECUTIVE FUNCTION HIGHLIGHT:

New School Year

Children are continuously learning to keep their personal belongings organized, manage their emotions, stay focused during instruction, manage time effectively and solve problems. Parents and educators need to support them in these areas!

Strategies for executive function development:

- Create morning and evening routines at home
- Teach and model routines to promote independence
- · Talk about executive functioning skills
- Provide time to organize belongings at school and home
- Encourage problem solving discussions
- . Create a space for homework completion
- Limit screen time and encourage physical activity
- , Read daily with your child
- Make time for brain breaks
- Support emotional well-being
- Keep a calendar visible with important dates listed
- Teach your child how to use a planner
- Open and consistent communication between school and home
- Involve your child in the planning process
- Check in with your child
- Set goals and prioritize tasks
- * Learn to tell time with an analog clock
- Practice time management
- Discuss coping strategies that work for your child


